USEFUL PHRASES

(Loch Lomond)

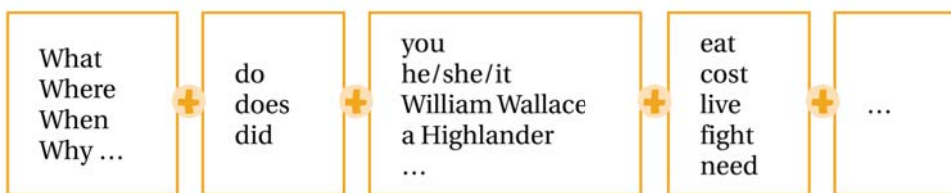
Say ten English words that start with 'c'.

- Who **is/ was** XY?
- Who **lived** there?
- Who **played** ...?

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
